1. The PLH will appoint a competent and experienced acoustic consultant who will provide a comprehensive Noise Management Plan which will form part of the ESMP. All activities during the event shall take place in accordance with the agreed Noise Management Plan.
2. The Music Noise Level must not exceed 65dB(A) over a 15 minute period measured at 1m from the boundary of any noise sensitive premises.
3. A maximum level of 75dB(A) in either the 63Hz or 125Hz octave frequency band must not be exceeded at any noise sensitive premises measured at 1m from the boundary. If complaints are received, these must be logged by the event organiser and the event noise consultant must monitor and reduce accordingly to achieve the limit as necessary.
4. Music from the event must only take place between the hours of 11am and 23.00 hours on the 2 permitted days of the 9th July 2022 and 10th July 2022.
5. Music from the event must start being reduced at 22.30, to ensure complete turn off of the music by 23.00.
6. The sound amplification systems will not be used by the PLH after the permitted hours of musical entertainment on any night of the Festival for the relaying of music or for any purpose except for emergency announcements relating to public safety.
7. The PLH must notify the Public Protection Team at least 7 days in advance of any sound tests in order that monitoring can take place.
